



## Parish Communion

A warm welcome to All Saints with Holy Trinity, whether you are worshipping in the church building or joining in from home via our [All Saints YouTube Channel](#)

**Communion** will be distributed to you in your seat (bread only) and a steward will offer you hand sanitiser. Gluten free bread is available, please speak to a steward before the service. For those at home you may wish to make your Spiritual Communion using the prayer that will be on the screen.

Please keep your face mask on throughout the service, join in with the words in **bold type** but refrain from singing. We look forward to the day when congregational singing can resume but

until then please listen to those who will sing on our behalf.

**Children** are an important part of our church family and we welcome the noise of infants into our midst acknowledging the challenge of worshipping with young ones when we cannot offer our usual Little Saints activities.

Our service is live streamed so those at home can join us in worship. If you would prefer to not be seen on camera please speak to a steward who will ensure you are seated appropriately.

During the summer months and when the weather allows, there is an invitation to stay after the service outside on the Parish Green for a picnic lunch.

# The Gathering

## Processional Hymn

Please stand as the ministers process.

## The Greeting

Grace, mercy and peace  
from God our Father  
and the Lord Jesus Christ  
be with you.  
**and also with you.**

An informal welcome is given and the theme of the service introduced.

## Prayers of Penitence

Please sit as the deacon or lay assistant invites us to confess our sins using this prayer or the responses that follow.

**Most merciful God,  
Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
we confess that we have sinned  
in thought, word and deed.  
We have not loved you with our whole heart.  
We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.  
In your mercy  
forgive what we have been,  
help us to amend what we are,  
and direct what we shall be;  
that we may do justly,  
love mercy,  
and walk humbly with you, our God.  
Amen.**

**OR**

Lord have mercy  
**Lord have mercy**

Christ have mercy  
**Christ have mercy**

Lord have mercy  
**Lord have mercy**

The president says words of forgiveness in a prayer of absolution.

**Amen.**

## Gloria in Excelsis

We stand as we either listen to a sung setting of this ancient hymn of praise or are invited to say the words together.

**Glory to God in the highest,  
and peace to his people on earth.  
Lord God, heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship you, we give you thanks,  
we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,  
Lord God, Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world:  
have mercy on us;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father:  
receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ,  
with the Holy Spirit,  
in the glory of God the Father.  
Amen.**

### **The Collect**

The president introduces a period of silent prayer with the words 'let us pray'. All remain standing for the period of silence and the collect - the special prayer for the day - and all respond.

**Amen.**

## **The Liturgy of the Word**

### **Readings**

We sit to listen to the readings appointed for the day. At the end of each the following is said:

This is the word of the Lord.  
**Thanks be to God.**

### **Gospel Reading**

We stand as an alleluia is sung and the minister moves to the lectern to proclaim the Gospel.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*.  
**Glory to you, O Lord.**

The Gospel for the day is proclaimed.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.  
**Praise to you, O Christ.**

We sit after the preacher offers an introductory prayer.

### **Sermon**

After the sermon follows a moment of silent reflection then all stand to say the words of the Creed or an Affirmation of Faith.

## **The Creed**

**We believe in one God,  
the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is,  
seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God,  
eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
of one Being with the Father;  
through him all things were made.  
For us and our salvation he came down from heaven,  
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary  
and was made man.  
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,  
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come.  
Amen.**

**OR**

### **Affirmation of Faith**

Let us declare our faith in God.

**We believe in God the Father,  
From whom every family  
In heaven and on earth is named.**

**We believe in God the Son,  
Who lives in our hearts through faith,  
And fills us with his love.**

**We believe in God the Holy Spirit,  
Who strengthens us  
With power from on high.**

**We believe in one God;  
Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen**

## Prayers of Intercession

All sit for the prayers, which are led by a member of the congregation. One of the following responses may be used or another response may be given.

Lord in your mercy  
hear our prayer.

**OR**

Lord hear us  
Lord graciously hear us.

The prayers conclude with these words:

Merciful Father,  
**accept these prayers  
for the sake of your Son,  
our Saviour Jesus Christ.  
Amen.**

## The Liturgy of the Sacrament

### The Peace

We stand. The president introduces the peace with some appropriate words.

The peace of the Lord be always with you  
**and also with you.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We remain in our places, but turn around and make the sign of peace to one another. We sit to listen to the Offertory Hymn, whilst the bread and wine are brought forward.

### Taking of the Bread and Wine

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:  
through your goodness we have this bread to set before you,  
which earth has given and human hands have made.  
It will become for us the bread of life.  
**Blessed be God for ever.**

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation:  
through your goodness we have this wine to set before you,  
fruit of the vine and work of human hands.  
It will become for us the cup of salvation.  
**Blessed be God for ever.**

The president washes their hands symbolising our desire to come together at the Lord's table with pure hearts and minds. Please stand.

### The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you  
**And also with you**

Lift up your hearts.  
**We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

The president praises God for His mighty acts. We say the words of the Sanctus:

**Holy, Holy, Holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

The president recalls the Last Supper and then this acclamation is used.

Great is the mystery of faith:  
**Christ has died:  
Christ is risen:  
Christ will come again.**

The prayer continues leading into the final words of praise. We all join in with the Amen.

... in songs of everlasting praise:  
**Blessing and honour and glory and power  
be yours for ever and ever. Amen.**

**OR**

... for ever and ever. **Amen**

We sit and observe a period of silence.

## **The Lord's Prayer**

We say this prayer together, each in our own language. It may be led by a member of the congregation using one of the global languages that make up our intercultural community.

As our saviour taught us, so we pray

**Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name,  
your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread.  
Forgive us our sins  
as we forgive those who sin against us  
Lead us not into temptation  
but deliver us from evil.  
For the kingdom, the power,  
and the glory are yours  
now and for ever.  
Amen.**

## **Breaking of the Bread**

We break this bread  
to share in the body of Christ.  
**Though we are many, we are one body,  
because we all share in one bread.**

While the President breaks the remaining consecrated bread we say together the ancient prayer known as the Agnus Dei.

**Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world,  
have mercy on us.**

**Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world,  
have mercy on us.**

**Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world,  
grant us peace.**

### **Giving of Communion**

The president gives an invitation to communion.

God's holy gifts  
for God's holy people.  
**Jesus Christ is holy,  
Jesus Christ is Lord,  
to the glory of God the Father.**

During the distribution of communion music will be played or sung.

To receive the bread of communion:

Please remain in your seat. A steward will accompany the communion minister so you can sanitize your hands. Put out your hands to receive the bread from the minister or deacon.

To receive a prayer of blessing:

Please remain in your seat and keep your hands down by your sides to indicate to the ministers if that is your wish. You do not need to remove your face covering.

### **Prayer after Communion**

A brief silence is kept. The president says the post communion prayer for the day before we say the following prayer together:

**We thank you Lord,  
that you have fed us in this sacrament,  
united us with Christ,  
and given us a foretaste of the heavenly banquet  
prepared for all peoples.  
Amen.**

## **The Dismissal**

Notices and publishing of the banns of marriage.

### **The Blessing**

We stand for the president to give the blessing to which all respond.

**Amen.**

### **Closing Hymn**

A hymn is sung

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord  
**In the name of Christ. Amen.**

## Recessional Music or Organ Voluntary

Please remain standing in your seats until the ministers have passed by and then sit to enjoy the music leaving when you are ready in a socially distanced manner.

Please **do not** socialise in the church building but make use of outdoors to greet one another. When the weather allows you are invited to stay for lunch on the Parish Green.

You can take this order of service away with you to bring back next week or please place it in one of the boxes by the exits.
